About the Course

Autism Navigator for Classroom Success in PreK to 2nd Grade is a self-paced 15 to 20 hour online professional development course with interactive slides and practical video examples. There is no need to purchase special materials or a curriculum. The content will enable teachers to support students with the materials and activities already available in the classroom.

It will put in the hands of families hundreds of video illustrations of evidence-based intervention techniques they can implement in everyday activities they are already doing to support their child's learning as soon as they suspect autism.
